Dr Toni Risson author of 'Aphrodite and the Mixed Grill' will tell us about the Greek Café in Queensland; Angelo Hatsatouris will provide an insider's look at a Greek picture theatre family in country NSW; and Peter Prineas will describe how Greek cafés were once a social hub in rural towns, illustrating his point with the example of the Allies Café in Junee NSW. 3.00pm Film - Cecil B. DeMille's 'Cleopatra'

Cecil B. DeMille's epic movie 'Cleopatra' was released in 1934 and screened at the Bingara Roxy in July 1936. This 80 year old classic stars Claudette Colbert and features lavish sets and fabulous costumes and scenes that are best appreciated on the big screen.

The Cleopatra barge scene and the death of the Greek-Egyptian Queen are considered to be two of the most memorable sequences in DeMille's career. 'Cleopatra' was a box office success, gained five Academy Award nominations and won the Oscar for Best Cinematography. Ends 4.40pm

5.00pm Film - 'Rembetika: The Blues Of Greece'

On loan from the National Sound and Film Archive, Rembetika: The Blues of Greece is narrated by Anthony Quinn and full of Greek Rembetika music, a kind of Greek blues popular both in Greece and the Greek diaspora. Ends 5.47pm

7.00pm Bingara Roxy Greek Museum - Official Opening Ceremony



Local olive producers will have stalls featuring local products.


You can pay tribute to a Greek family or friend who has made the journey to Australia by purchasing an olive tree for \$100.00.

'Caddie' is a 1976 movie directed by Donald Crombie and representative of the Australian film renaissance of



that decade. Set around the time of the Great Depression, it tells the story of Caddie (played by Helen Morse), a young middle class woman struggling to raise two children after her marriage break up. After a failed affair with a sharp bookmaker (Jack Thompson) Caddie falls in love with a Greek man (Takis Emmanuel). The story includes scenes of Greek community life in Australia in

the 1930s. 'Caddie' made Helen Morse a local star and earned Jacki Weaver and Melissa Jaffer Australian Film Institute Awards. Ends 1.16pm
